By the time 1964 model year rolled around the Plymouth Valiant had come a long way since its introduction in 1960. When the domestic manufacturers responded to the foreign imports by creating their own compact cars the plan was to plug the sales leak that had been led mainly by VW Beetles. Rather than emulate the route taken by Rambler, the big three were rethinking the situation.



Over at Chrysler the solution was to meet the foreign cars in all ways, not just size. Since the foreign cars had some sophisticated technology so would the new Mopar compact. The slant six engine is famous today for being indestructible but its original claim to fame was based on its brilliant design.
